Adverse Weather

If we experience any severe snowfall in the coming term, we will endeavour to operate normally wherever possible. Any closures will be in exceptional circumstances and be in the interests of health and safety. A school closure could be directed by the Local Authority which would mean that all maintained schools in the city must close. Alternatively, a local school closure may be necessary due to conditions specifically around our school.

Should a decision to close be made across all schools, information will be shared on the "Wolverhampton Today" Facebook page, the City of Wolverhampton Council's Twitter feed and on the City of Wolverhampton Council's Website.

If there is no definite announcement about Wolverhampton schools by 7:30am, it can be assumed that there has not been a general closure.

As a school, we will send a text message to all parents as soon as a decision to close is taken (either by the LA or by school.) and where possible, we will give as much notice as possible. I am sure however, you can appreciate that forecasts can be uncertain and there are times when the weather can take us somewhat by surprise!

Medicines in school

A reminder that ALL medicines must be signed into school through the office and a form must be completed.

Under no circumstances should children bring medicines into school to keep in their bag and administer themselves.



Personal items

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly named. We have had a number of parents report that their child has come home with the wrong cardigan/jumper/hoodie or unfortunately, that theirs has gone missing. If items are labelled, it makes it much easier for staff to match the correct item with the correct child! Please could parents



also check the items that children are bringing home in case they have picked up the wrong one.

Snacks

A reminder that children in Early Years (Nursery and Reception) and Key Stage One (Year 1 and 2) should not bring in snack items as these are provided by school.

In Key Stage Two (Years 3 to 6), children may bring in a healthy snack to enjoy at playtime. This should be a healthy snack bar or piece of fruit. No chocolate bars, sweets or crisps.

Children should bring in a filled water bottle every day. Fizzy drinks are not allowed in school.

A reminder that we are a 'no nut school' and ask that parents/carers do not send items that obviously contain nuts in for snack or in lunchboxes. We appreciate your support and understanding with this.

Children up to the age of 5 are provided with daily milk, free of charge. If your child is 5 or over and you would like them to continue having a daily drink of milk, please make payment (£10 for the Spring term) via the

Gateway app from Tuesday 3rd. If your child receives Income-Based Free School Meals, school provide their milk so no payment is necessary.
