Learning Journeys: Assessment and Reporting

We are delighted to be able to teach your children as they continue their learning journeys. Following the unexpected detour from conventional learning, forced by the Covid-19 lockdown, it has been important to ascertain where your child is on their learning journey. We need to know where they are so that we can move them forward securely and speedily during this academic year.

Please help your child by encouraging them:

- \checkmark to complete their homework on time
- ✓ to read daily with you ideally
- ✓ to learn the Maths Key Instant Recall Facts (on website: Learning/ Mathematics)

We were hoping to have sent attainment reports on 16th October. However, we have decided to take a while longer to understand how your child is coping with the expectations of a new year group.

Autumn Term reports will now be issued on Wednesday 4th November.

COVID-19 UPDATE

We continue to be extremely thankful for the support that you have given to ensure that a safe, purposeful and calm return to school.

We are constantly reviewing our systems to provide an environment that is as safe as possible for the children and staff. Since we have returned to school, Wolverhampton has become a National Intervention Area. We must not become complacent in terms of social distancing, maintaining class bubbles, hygiene etc.

We would like to draw your attention the following issues:

- Please BE ON TIME when bringing and collecting your child to and from school.
- You are encouraged to wear a face mask when you bring or collect your child unless you are sure that you can maintain a 2m distance from staff and other families.
- We recommend that you do not linger around school eg in the play area once you have collected your child at the end of the day.
- It is imperative that we have reliable contact numbers.
