Uniform

All children should wear correct uniform in line with our Uniform Policy which can be viewed here.

St Paul's maroon jumper or cardigan

White shirt with maroon & silver tie / blouse / white or maroon St Paul's polo Grey trousers / skirt / pinafore

Grey/white/maroon socks/tights

Black school shoes (no heels or trainers please)

If the weather is warm during September, Summer uniform can be worn.

Long hair should be tied up. Children may wear maroon/white/black bobbles, hair band or small bow.

Small stud earrings may be worn for pierced ears – these should be removed on PE days.

No other jewellery should be worn except for items worn for religious reasons (e.g a Kara)

Nail varnish and tattoos should not be worn to school.

All children are expected to wear the correct active uniform for PE and Games; a maroon St Paul's hoodie, maroon St Paul's sports top and black joggers / leggings or shorts. Items should not have other logos on.

Support is available to families who are struggling with the financial impact of uniforms – please speak to Mrs Ferretti or the school office.

We also operate a preloved uniform / coat and shoe rail throughout the year.

All children should bring a named, refillable water bottle every day.

All items should be clearly named to enable staff to return items to the correct owner!

<u>Trips</u> We are delighted to have arranged a range of trips this year meaning that all children have been able to enjoy enrichment activities beyond the classroom.

We are all too aware of the financial pressures being placed upon families currently and seek to do what we can to support our families. As a school, we heavily subsidise trips and visits for all children and even more so for families who are eligible for Pupil Premium. Payments for school trips and visits during the day are voluntary. However, we are only able to continue to offer these valuable experiences if sufficient payments are received. Unfortunately, this year, trips WILL have to be cancelled if they are not financially viable. Please do make payments if possible to enable us to continue offering these opportunities in future years.

This year, we are looking forward to visiting;

A range of places of worship – (church, mosque, gurdwara, temple, synagogue), Blists Hill, Safeside, Sarehole Mill, Cosford, Lunt Fort, The Grand Theatre, The Rep Theatre, Warwick Castle, Kingswood.

We also have a number of in school visits and experiences planned to enhance our curriculum and the children's personal development.

The School Day

As you know, term starts for children in Reception to Year 6 and existing Nursery children on **Wednesday 6th September**. (New Nursery children wil start as per transition arrangements) The school day remains as follows –



The gates will open at 8.35am and classroom doors will open at 8.40am, when children should be in school. The gates will be closing at 8.50am. Please ensure your child arrives for school on time in the mornings – learning starts promptly.

In the interests of site security, and to enable us to lock the gate promptly, parents arriving with their child at 8.50am will be asked to drop their child(ren) at the gate. A member of staff will ensure that children walk safely to their classes.

Parents are asked to drop and leave promptly to avoid getting locked in when the gate closes. If still on site after 8.50am, please ask classroom staff to let you out through the front office.

Parents arriving with their children after 8.50am will need to take them to the front office where they will be asked to sign them in as late.

A reminder for parents to please enter the school site through the pedestrian gate by the Year 5 classroom and exit via the playground pedestrian gate at the end of the day.

The end of the day will be 3.15pm for all classes.

Support for families - Pre-loved coats / uniform and shoes and our food bank

A reminder that we have a rail of uniform, coats and shoes in the front entrance for families. Please visit the front office if you would like to select anything for your child.



If you have any preloved uniform/coats or shoes in good condition that you are able to donate or swap, please send them in.

We hope this initiative will support families who are feeling the pressures of the cost of living increases.

We also have our food bank in the front entrance. If any parents would like to donate or receive, please pop into the school office. We do have a link with a local charity who are providing support to families and can provide food parcels, vouchers and period products. Please speak to the office or Mrs Ferretti if you are in need of support.

Medicines

If your child requires medicine during the school day, whether for a long-term health condition such as asthma or a short-term illness such as an ear infection, we are able to administer medicines to children **if necessary**. All medicines must be signed into school and a form **must** be completed. Medicines **must** be in their original packaging with instructions/dosage and, if prescribed, **must** have the label with the child's name. If your child's medicine is given, staff will inform you be text/telephone call/letter and/or verbal message at the end of the day. As it is the start of the new year, we will be asking all parents to complete new medical forms to ensure we have the most up to date and accurate information to hand in school.



Under no circumstances should children bring medicines into school to keep in their bag and administer themselves.

Music Lessons

As you may know, we are proud to be able to offer children in Years 3 -6 the opportunity to learn an instrument at a significantly subsidised cost. If your child is in Year 3, 4, 5 or 6 and would be interested in lessons, please read the relevant information here.

Children in Year 3 in September will also be given the opportunity to learn the ukulele as part of our Music curriculum offer.

Parent Governor / Governing Board

We are delighted to inform you that we have welcomed a new Parent Governor to our Governing Body following our election during the Summer term. I know **Mrs Pearce** is looking forward to working with the Governing Body and supporting the future development of the school.

A reminder that our Governing Body consists of Mr J Gill (Chair of Governors), Mrs L Devers and Rev D Wills (Co Vice-Chairs), Mrs A Ratcliffe, Mrs L Clarke and Mr J Banla (Foundation Governors), Mr L Campbell and Mrs C Pearce (Parent Governors) and Mrs J Pooler (Associate Governor). We currently have a Staff Governor vacancy which will be filled in the next few weeks and two Foundation Governor vacancies. If you or someone you knows has a Church connection and would be interested in joining our Governing Body, please contact Mrs Ferretti or Mr Gill (Chair of Governors) via the office.

No Nut School

A polite reminder to all parents that we are a 'No Nut School' and ask that parents refrain from sending children into school with nuts or items obviously containing nuts (peanut butter and Nutella for example). We do have a number of children in school who have a nut allergy and whilst we can never guarantee that children won't come into contact with nuts, these measures will help reduce risk. We also have a number of other, wider measures in school to manage food intolerances and ensure our children remain safe. We acknowledge the health benefits of nuts but recommend that these are enjoyed outside of school.



Could we also ask that parents ensure that any grapes sent into school for snack or packed lunches are **cut in half** as whole grapes present a hazard.

Finally, when selecting snacks for KS2 children to enjoy at lunchtime, please ensure it is a healthy item – fruit or a cereal bar for example, **no crisps or chocolate**

bars. Sweets should not be brought into school unless for a birthday in which case they should be handed to the class teacher in the morning to share out.

School Dinners

We work closely with Catering Services at City of Wolverhampton Council to best provision for our children and share feedback from children and parents. Last term the service manager met with our School Council to devise our new menu which can be viewed here (also on our school website). We hope the children enjoy the choices! As we all know, children can be fussy and sometimes don't want all the items of on the menu. However, as part of our duty to provide children with a balanced meal, kitchen staff have been directed to ensure that children are served with all items, for example, the main, potatoes / pasta and veg/salad. Read about the School Meal Food Standards here. Staff will not 'force' children to finish their plate or eat food they do not like but will encourage them to try a range of things.

Parents may want to look at the menu with their child at home each day to help them decide what they would like to choose from the menu.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 do not have to pay for their meals, as part of the Government's Universal Infant Free School Meal offer. From Year 3, children are required to pay for their meals (£2.70 per day, or £2.20 for flexi charging) unless eligible for benefit related Free School Meals. For information visit Gov.uk or City of Wolverhampton website.

Milk is provided free of charge to children until the term after their 5th birthday. After this, milk can be paid for (£10 a term) via the Gateway app if your child wishes to have it each day.

<u>Enrichment Clubs...</u> will begin again from Monday 18th September and will run until w/c Monday 23rd October. Information about our offer this term will be sent out on Friday 8th September.


