#### The School Day



Last term we saw an improvement in punctuality with fewer children coming in through the office in the mornings. Thank you to parents for getting their children to school in time! Due to the works on the carpark, we have been using just one gate for drop off and collection recently. This will continue next half term. Once the work has been completed, the gate by Year 5 will continue to be used for drop-off but

at the end of the day, the Year 5 gate will be used for entry during collection and the new gate will be used for exit.


Gates open at 8.35am and classroom doors will open at 8.40am, when children should be in school. The gates close at 8.50am.

In the interests of site security, and to enable us to lock the carpark gates promptly, parents arriving with their child at 8.50am will be asked to drop their child(ren) at the gate. A member of staff will ensure that children walk safely to their classes.

Parents arriving with their children after 8.50am will need to take them to the front office where they will be asked to sign them in as late.

Parents of children in Nursery and Reception may now exit via the new wooden gate on the KS1 playground to join the path to the KS2 playground, avoiding the bottleneck that can sometimes occur in the courtyard.

A reminder that the **day ends at 3.15pm** for all classes.





#### Uniform

Thank you to parents who have purchased our new Active PE Uniform. We are aware that some parents are still waiting for their order to be fulfilled with Lads and Lasses – they have emailed me to let me know that all orders should soon be completed.

If you haven't yet ordered the correct items for your child, please do so as soon as possible. We do appreciate that there are financial pressures on families at the moment, however, parents were informed of the new school uniform before Easter to give parents plenty of time to spread the cost of items. If parents require support with uniform, please speak with me or the school office.

Year 6. Please complete your consent form via the link that was sent via text.


#### **Poppies**

#### Personal items

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly named. We have had a number of parents report that their child has come home with the wrong cardigan/jumper/hoodie or unfortunately, that theirs has gone missing. If items are labelled, it makes it much easier for staff to match the correct item with the correct child! Please could parents also check the items that children are bringing home in case they have picked up the wrong one.

#### **Snacks**

A reminder that children in Early Years (Nursery and Reception) and Key Stage One (Year 1 and 2) should not bring in snack items as these are provided by school.

In Key Stage Two (Years 3 to 6), children may bring in a healthy snack to enjoy at playtime. This should be a healthy snack bar or piece of fruit. **No chocolate bars, sweets or crisps.** 

Children should bring in a filled water bottle every day. Fizzy drinks are not allowed in school.

A reminder that we are a 'no nut school' and ask that parents/carers do not send items that obviously contain nuts in for snack or in lunchboxes. We appreciate your support and understanding with this.

We hope to arrange some workshops and activities later on in the term, giving parents more opportunities to come in and share in the day to day life of the school.

#### Open Door Policy

We are very proud of our open-door policy and want parents to know they are always welcome to come into school and talk to staff. Mrs Ferretti will be on the playground every morning from 8.35am to welcome parents and children to school and answer as many queries as possible before the school day begins. However, if you require a private meeting, or to meet with your child's class teacher, please do arrange a mutually convenient time by contacting the school office, or speaking to the class teacher at the end of the day. Please discuss any concerns with class teachers in the first instance.

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#### Christmas 2022

We are looking forward to inviting parents back into school this year to share in

some of our traditional Christmas celebrations including Christmas performances!

Children in Nursery and Reception (Early Years) will be performing a Nativity, as will children in Year 1 and 2 (Key Stage 1). Children in Year 3,4,5 and 6 (Key Stage 2) will be performing a Christmas Concert, telling the Christmas story

through song, poems and readings. I am sure parents will be excited to come into school to enjoy these performances.

#### Site Projects

As you know, we were fortunate to secure funding from the Diocese of Lichfield to carry out improvements to our school site. Work on our fire doors and external fencing / carpark is nearly completed but some work will continue into the first week back. We are delighted that the rear of the school site is now much more secure and the carpark is safer and now suitable for use by visitors and staff during the day. A new pedestrian gate has been created so parents and children will no longer need to walk through the carpark to leave at the end of the day.

In the morning, we will continue to use one gate as this has worked well, with a gradual flow of traffic through the gate. At the end of the day however, we will open the new gate too so that parents can exit via this gate. It can be quite congested on the pathway by Year 5 and 6 as parents leave the school site so hopefully this will work better.

We are delighted that our site is now much more secure both inside and out due to these projects and works carried out over the last year. As you know, the safety and wellbeing of all the children and adults who use our site is paramount. Parents dropping off or collecting from Breakfast or After School Club can now use the intercom on the gate to let staff know they have arrived. Staff will come to the gate as before. The telephone can still be used to call and speak to Club Staff as the office isn't always manned after 4pm.

#### Firework Safety

Many of our families may be looking forward to firework displays and bonfires in



the coming days and weeks as part of Bonfire Night and Diwali celebrations. It is recommended that people attend organised displays, however, if planning your own fireworks display, please find important information and advice here;
