Next week, we welcome Mrs Evans, our new SENCO to St Paul's.

She will be in school one day a week until the end of July and two days a week from September. I know she is very excited to be coming in and is looking forward to getting to know our children and families.

In other exciting news, just before the half term holiday, we appointed Mrs Cook who will be joining our team in September as class teacher and core subject leader, and Miss Braden who will be starting her teaching career with us at St Paul's. I am sure they will both make positive contributions to our school and quickly feel part of the family!

<u>Uniform</u> A reminder that children may now wear our Summer uniform in warmer weather if they wish. This consists of –

Grey, tailored shorts with polo (maroon or white) or maroon (or red) gingham dress

All children are expected to wear the correct active uniform for PE and Games; a maroon St Paul's hoodie, maroon St Paul's sports top and black joggers / leggings or shorts. Items should not have other logos on.

Support is available to families who are struggling with the financial impact of uniforms – please speak to Mrs Ferretti or the school office.

If the weather is hot and sunny, please send your child to school with a sun hat and apply all day sun-cream in the morning.

All children should also bring a named, refillable water bottle to school every day.

We have a large number of unnamed uniform items in lost property. During the nicer weather, these items will be placed outside at home time – please claim your items!

Unclaimed items will be donated to charity.

Please ensure all items are clearly named to enable staff to return items to the correct owner.

Trips We are delighted to have arranged a range of trips this year meaning that all children have been able to enjoy enrichment activities beyond the classroom.

We are all too aware of the financial pressures being placed upon families currently and seek to do what we can to support our families. As a school, we heavily subsidise trips and visits for all children and even more so for families who are eligible for Pupil Premium. Payments for school trips and visits during the day are voluntary. However, we are only able to continue to offer these valuable experiences if sufficient payments are received. Please do make payments if possible to enable us to continue offering these opportunities in future years.



Sun Protection

As the weather becomes warmer (we hope!) we would advise that parents apply an 'all day' sun cream to their child before the start of the day. Please also remember to send your child to school with a sunhat to wear outdoors and a water bottle so that they can keep well hydrated.

Sunglasses can be worn on the playground but must be worn sensibly and should not be worn inside. As with other items, children are responsible for looking after sunglasses etc. Please ensure all items sent into school are clearly named.

Whilst we hope for sun, we also know how unpredictable the good old British weather can be! Please provide your child with a waterproof coat in case of rain!

No Nut School

A polite reminder to all parents that we are a 'No Nut School' and ask that parents refrain from sending children into school with nuts or items obviously containing nuts (peanut butter and Nutella for example). We have a number of children in school who have a nut allergy and whilst we can never guarantee that children won't come into contact with nuts, these measures will help reduce risk. We also have a number of other, wider measures in school to manage food intolerances and ensure our children remain safe. We acknowledge the health benefits of nuts but recommend that these are enjoyed outside of school.

Could we also ask that parents ensure that any grapes sent into school for snack or packed lunches are **cut in half** as whole grapes present a choking hazard.

Finally, when selecting snacks for KS2 children to enjoy at lunchtime, please ensure it is a healthy item – fruit or a cereal bar for example, not crisps or chocolate bars.

Sweets should not be brought into school unless for a birthday in which case they should be handed to the class teacher in the morning to share out.

<u>School Dinners</u> We work closely with Catering Services at City of Wolverhampton Council to ensure the best provision for our children and share feedback from children and parents. The current menu can be accessed <u>here</u> or on our school website. Later this term, we will be carrying out a Pupil Voice survey to help us inform our menu for 2023/24.

As we all know, children can be fussy and sometimes don't want all of the items on the menu. However, as part of our duty to provide children with a balanced meal, kitchen staff have been directed to ensure that children are served with all items, for example, the main, potatoes / pasta and veg / salad.


Staff will not 'force' children to finish their plate or eat food they do not like but will encourage them to try a range of things. Parents may want

to look at the menu with their child at home to help them decide what they would like to choose from the menu.

Funds raised through school-led clubs will be used to fund club resources / other clubs in the future.


