Everyday we:

Communication and Language (CL)

<u>Listening: & Attention</u> Listening games related to topic. Circle time.

<u>Speaking</u> Helicopter stories acting out story of the week, talking about pictures / objects in books using sentence starters. Role play in different areas. Play barrier games. Debates – Should the wall be knocked down?

<u>Comprehension</u>

Activities/ questioning and discussions around daily stories and books.

Following instructions when carrying out tasks, accessing resources.

Discuss what they have found out and share learning with others.

<u>Summer newsletter – I hope you find it useful !</u>

This half term our topic is 'Beyond The Great Wall!' We will be learning about Kings and Queens and looking at families. We will start by following the children's interests as to what they think might be behind Humpty Dumpty's Wall whilst also asking the question "Why was Humpty on the Wall?" We will provide stories and hooks to inspire the children and help them make links and share ideas – We will always try to provide resources and opportunities for children to carry out their own ideas.

On Mondays we will visit the library, so please make sure library books and library cards are in book their bags. Children will continue to explore the school grounds on Tuesdays through our Wild Tribes sessions, looking for new life during the warmer weather and making resources for our Royal "It's a Knockout".

PE will continue to be on a Tuesday and Friday, please ensure that your child is wearing their active uniform. We appreciate your support, you can help your child to succeed further by:

- Listening to them read their books.
- Talking about what they have done at school each day.
- Helping them with their 'Home Learning Tasks' and send their books back into school on Wednesdays.
- Asking them to help you at home, giving them 'little jobs to do' e.g lay the table, tidy away their toys, wash up.
- Sharing a bedtime story.
- Keep checking the school website and texts for updates.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development During Continuous provision

<u>Literacy</u>

<u>Daily Shared Reading.</u> Books from library service that children vote on relating to children's interests and topic placed in reading area.

<u>Focus Book / Stimuli</u> : Paddington at the Palace, Humpty Dumpty, Old King Cole, Sing a Song of Sixpence, Little Lumpty, Rapunzel, The Day the Crayons Quit, Zog, Pink is for Boys, Princess and the Pea, Jack and the Beanstalk, Knights and Castles

Weekly Writing: Spellings, sentence structure / making and writing own sentences related to our Drawing Club book of the week.

<u>Daily</u> Handwriting and Funky Finger activities, Squiggle Me Into a Writer, reading and matching words / sentences to pictures. Listening to stories, retelling and talking about main events, RWI 40 mins each day in ability groups. Drawing Club

Weekly Reading : Shared/ group reading and individual reading.

<u>Mathematics</u>

Exploring use of number during daily routines; register, dinner register, returning
pencils to pots, knowing the number of children at an activity, counting during wake
and shake / music and movement activities, disco flappers etc.
Say one more/ one less than Number of the Week.
Estimate amounts of bricks in a wall – count bricks were they correct? Were there
more/less?
Addition and subtraction to 5, 10, 15 20 and beyond, recording findings
Problem solving using own ideas and resources available when sharing, doubling,
halving and grouping.
Subitising different amounts/ say what you see.
How tall is the wall? Measure how far Humpty can roll – make him roll further.
