<u>English</u>

St Paul's C.E

Our work this term will be based around these books: **The Wolf's Footprints** by Susan Price and **Moon Man** by Tomi Ungerer (this book is carried over from last half term as we did an additional topic on Black History Month last term) Through these units, children will practise a range of writing skills and will be developing their grammar, spelling and punctuation skills. They will also be writing for a range of purposes: structuring and organising their writing; drafting and editing as they write. Children will enjoy taking part in a range of speaking and listening activities such a role play and discussion.

<u>Arts</u>

Our unit this half term will be based on 'space and dimension'. Children will learn how to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design. Children will look at foreground, middleground and background within a painting, to develop depth in their drawing and painting.

<u>Music</u> – Charanga <u>Modern Foreign Languages</u> - French <u>Computing</u> – Purple Mash

<u>Humanities</u>

In History, the children will continue to learn about Ancient Greece. The children will learn about Alexander the Great and will learn about how he built a vast empire. Later on in the curriculum, children will be able to contrast his achievements with other military leaders.

In Geography, the children will learn about Mediterranean Europe. Children will use maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term our maths will focus on multiplication and division, using non-formal and formal methods. We will also be exploring length and perimeter of shapes.

A reminder that Year 4 children are required to take a timed Multiplication Check during the summer term (June)- please keep practising these skills on TTRockstars! We will also be practising in class and will have a weekly times table test!

<u>Science</u>

Our topic for Autumn 2 is Electricity. We will construct a simple electrical circuit, identifying and naming the basic parts, including buzzer, bulb, cells, wires and switches. We will also identify common appliances which run on electricity.
