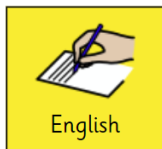

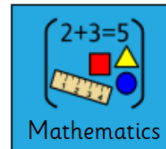

This term, children will be exploring a variety of texts and genres, such as recounts, letters and narratives in English. They will continue to deconstruct texts -identifying techniques

used by authors; they will develop their writing skills, learning how to enhance and change their writing by making appropriate grammatical and vocabulary choices and will continue to edit and improve their own work. The children will also be given the opportunity to read a range of high-quality texts; developing vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation and retrieval skills.



This term, children will be exploring a range of areas through their maths lessons. They will continue to build upon, secure and master their number and place value understanding. They will apply this learning to calculating with the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and to solving rich and complex problems. They will also be developing their understanding of fractions, including how to multiply and divide by integers.



Children will be making playground structures and automatic toys.



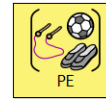
Children will continue to explore creation and science, followed by exploring the question: Is God the Messiah?



Children will be continuing to learn how to be themselves in the world and will be morning on to celebrating differences between different people.



Children will build upon their prior knowledge of electricity. They will investigate the number and voltage of cells within a circuit, how different components function and draw circuits using symbols.



Children will be practising skills in football and will be developing their skills in dance.



Our history learning will be all about the Suffragette movement. We will focus on the build up to these events and what

impact they have had on the world that we live in today. In our Geography lessons, we will be investigating British geographical issues such as: air pollution, flooding, waste and litter. Children will explore this through the use of data and a range of policies.
