Statutory Assessments

We were incredibly proud of our Year 6's who tackled their SATs with a fantastic attitude last half term. Whatever their results – they can be proud that they tried their best – as we are of them!

This half term, Year 4 will be completing their Multiplication Times Tables Check;

In addition, our Year 1 children (and some Year 2 children) will be completing their <u>Phonic Screen</u> during the week commencing Monday 9th June.

KS1 SATs are no longer compulsory. However, our Year 2 will be completing the optional tests during June. These tests will replace other assessments that the children would usually complete at the end of each term so will not create any additional assessments. The results of these assessments will provide a useful benchmark as the children prepare to move into KS2.

Sun Protection

As the weather becomes warmer (we hope!) we would advise that parents apply an 'all day' sun cream to their child before the start of the day. Please also remember to send



your child to school with a sunhat to wear outdoors and a water bottle so that they can keep well hydrated.

Allowances are of course made for children with dietary, sensory needs or SEND.

School attendance is vital for a child's future success.


This year we are aiming to further improve our whole school attendance and would appreciate parents' support in ensuring children are always at school when they are able to be.




